First of all accept my heartiest congratulations on 40 years long inning of PODJ which is still playing a leading role.

I appreciate your concern regarding the future of PODJ but at the same time let us not forget the ground realities. The quality of research depends on research facilities, financial support and environment of the institution. Another factor could be the curative approach to the disease instead of prevention. This being the main reason why most of the journals receive articles based on data analysis. You will also appreciate that major contributors to local journals are clinicians who share their own experiences through clinical studies. If PODJ stops receiving such articles in future, this will send a negative message among these contributors. I think a better approach will be that articles based on original research, epidemiological studies and randomized clinical trials shall be preferred over other articles based on data analysis.

I am personally a strong advocate of the opinion that a Medical/Dental Journal must have a managerial office in the institute for the following reasons; ¹Strong faculty component ²Less financial burden ³Strong IT Department ⁴No separate logistics required in the form of office and HR ⁵Some universities have their own printing press

If the journal is not based in the institute or has a strong financial background, the management is left with no other option but to charge as per requirement of the journal for its existence.

You are very right sir that it is time of extraordinary change. We need to modify our publishing policies according to the need and pace of the time to meet the changing requirements. Suggestions regarding the issues you raised are as below:

¹Emphsis should be given to original research (epidemiological studies, and randomized clinical trials). Out of the total 10 articles to be published in one issue, there should be 8 such articles (epidemiological studies, and randomized clinical trials) and only 2 articles of surveys and data analysis should be included.

²People who are writing good original articles should be appreciated to send their articles to this journal for publication.

³Work should be done to improve the indexing of the journal to increase the interest of people for publication in this journal.

⁴Journal can be shifted to complete OJS for better handling and fast working.

⁵To raise the funds of the journal publication charges can be increased accordingly.

⁶A new system of fast track publication can be introduced. Authors requesting for fast track publication can be reviewed at double the cost of publication. Quota can be fixed in an issue for fast track publication. For example, 4 articles in an issue can be published on fast track and 6 articles on normal charges.

⁷Cost of normal publication charges can be increased and for fast track publication it may be Rs:50000.

Only studies with authentic questionnaires which are already tested and available online or in books should be acceptable for PODJ. In all international journals, studies based on questionnaires are not self made and authors are supposed to give reference in their articles. Clinical studies are the best. Moreover, change should be gradual.
